## Implementation Steering Committee Update

During February, the Implementation Steering Committee sought input from our pastors on the organization and responsibilities of Regional Conferences of Churches (RCC). This process was undertaken through a series of small group meetings conducted by various members of the Steering Committee. The Steering Committee sincerely appreciates the wonderful turnout and the great diversity of ideas put forth for the Regional Conferences of Churches (RCC). If the energy that was present in our meetings is directed toward the work of the Regional Conferences, it will have a very strong, positive influence on the health of our individual congregations and our province.

On March 4th prior to the Moravian Ministry Association meeting, pastors unable to attend the small group meetings, along with all other ordained ministers and retired pastors will have an opportunity to participate in the process. Later in March, Christian Educators will also participate in the input process.

Early in March, a communication piece will go out to churches to help inform congregants of what a Regional Conferences of Churches (RCC) is, how it will be initially organized and directing church boards to begin their process of appointing representatives from their congregation to the Regional Conference to which they are assigned. Each church will have three representatives. There will be a pastor and two lay representatives from the congregation at large. The Steering Committee will ask for a list of representatives from each congregation no later than April 15th with the first meetings of the Regional Conferences scheduled to take place in May.

Once the Regional Conferences of Churches (RCC) are established, a representative from each Regional Conference will be elected to sit on the Board of Cooperative Ministries (BCM). It is anticipated that the BCM will begin meeting in June or July.

We continue to consider our Province to be a community in transition, and we ask for the ongoing prayers of the Province during this process. We also continue to find confidence in the watchword for the date we began our work: "Surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." (Jeremiah 29:11)

## PEC REPORT:



The Provincial Elders' Conference met on February 2 and 16, 2010. All members of the Conference were present for both meetings, and each meeting began with sharing of contacts with pastors and congregations followed by a time of intercessory prayer.

Various concerns and opportunities were discussed related to congregations, fellowships and personnel in the Province. The PEC continues to work with the Joint Boards of Hopewell and Fairview through the call process. The Rev. Dan Conrad returned to pastoral service at Advent effective February 8 following a medical leave of absence. The Rev. Scott Venable was granted additional personal medical leave of absence from his responsibilities as Associate Pastor of Home Church. Bro. Alphonso Gaydon was approved as a Congregational Acolyte at St. Philips. PEC reaffirmed the calls to specialized ministry for the Rev. Robert Wolfe (Forsyth Jail and Prison Ministry) and the Rev. Logan Jones (Rex Hospital, Raleigh, NC). The Ordination Review Committee for 2010 was appointed as follows: the Rev. Judy Knopf, the Rev. Carol Foltz, and Bro. Gary Kniskern. Two candidates for ordination complete their seminary requirements this spring: Sr. Betty Helms and Bro. Russell Williams.

PEC received reports on meetings of the Structure Implementation Steering Committee (see report in this issue of Provincial Ties), and continued discussion of plans for the stated Synod of September 2010, including invitations to ecumenical partners for representation and formation of committees on government and finance. PEC will meet in special session on March 2 to continue discussion and planning for Synod. Bishop Lane Sapp also reported on the recent meeting of the Florida District Board and the presbyteral consecration of the Rev. Willie

Israel at Rolling Hills Moravian Church. PEC gave approval to the draft of a document from the Interprovincial Faith and Order Commission titled, "Who Are Moravians?" It is anticipated that the statement will be available for use by congregations and individuals later this year.

Bishop Sam Gray met with PEC on February 2 to discuss matters related to the call and ordination of persons for service outside the Southern Province in cross cultural ministry. PEC will seek additional advice and guidance on this matter from the Board of World Mission.

PEC discussed possible ways to improve communication with and connection to retired pastors, as well as steps needed to implement the grant application process this spring for the Petree Fund.

Various other matters, as well as requests and questions from congregations and pastors, were discussed and information shared concerning the ongoing ministries of the Province. The next scheduled meetings of the PEC are on March 2 and 16, 2010.

## From the Provincial Treasurer's Office

**2009 Church Audits** – Instructions for performing the 2009 “audits” of churches have been sent to all Church Treasurers and Trustee Chairs/Vice Chairs. Please be sure these instructions are given to your Church’s “Audit Committee.” Per the Book of Order, 2009 audit reports are due by May 15, 2010. If you did not receive your instructions, please give us a call or you can download them off the provincial website at [mcsp.org](http://mcsp.org). They can be found under Resources/Year-end Forms.

**2010 Congregational Information Form** – If you haven’t already done so, please be sure this form is sent in to the PEC office as soon as possible. We all use this information to be sure that we are communicating with the current leadership at each church. The form is also available on the provincial website under Resources/Year-end Forms.

**Sales Tax Refunds** – How would you like to receive a discount on almost everything you buy at the store? Well, that is what churches can get due to their non-profit status. I am sure that most churches already file for sales tax refunds (or have sales tax exemption certificates), but if you don’t, you are walking away from “free” money.

The rules are fairly straightforward as to what does or doesn’t qualify. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to give Lois Crain (the resident expert) a call at (336) 722-7922, ext. 1003.

**403(b) Plan** – Our new 403(b) plan, administered by the ELCA Board of Pensions, is now up and running. I am pleased that we have added several new participants but we still have only have 37 participants making monthly contributions and only 24 of these are pastors. This means that about two thirds of our pastors currently do not participate. Since withdrawals from the plan are now housing

allowance qualified, many pastors are missing out on this potentially significant tax advantage. All employees working 20 hours or more per week are eligible to participate and you can sign-up at any time during the year. ## Newsletter Notes

*From around the Southern Province*

So you have had it up to here with snow this winter. Casting back in our church records we can find some whoppers. How about 1800, when the **Salem** Diary for February 2 says: "Snow began this morning about eight o'clock and grew worse steadily, continuing until the next day at noon." And this sentence, which Archivist Daniel Crews says often appears in the church diaries: "The snow was so deep that the oldest inhabitant in this neighborhood said that he had never seen one like it." The result: about 1½ feet of snow with drifts in Salem of five feet. And then it snowed again March 7, another eight inches. That got **Friedberg** to move its anniversary date from March to May 12, when it is still observed today.

On prayerful consideration and careful study of its history, **Calvary** has decided to observe its anniversary on a Sunday near the actual date, April 20. Hope it doesn't snow.

**King** has made it official to purchase its first pipe organ and to have a three-year capital campaign to raise the needed \$440,000.

**Mayodan** and **Messiah** began the year right. Mayodan received an anonymous donation of \$5,000 toward purchase of another van. The church now has a "van fund" to raise the total cost. Messiah received a \$50,000 gift, which will allow for re-roofing the sanctuary and Sunday school building and other needed repairs.

**Covenant** has joined the crowd of churches with a beautiful new sign. Dedication will be in March. Hope it doesn't snow.

**Raleigh** held its "first annual Putzing Adventure" in December to have folks show their nativity displays to the wider community. It expected 20-25 displays. It got 47, and from all over the world.

Exciting headline in one church newsletter: "Do you *think* you want to be a 'Moravian'? Don't they have a tabernacle in Utah? Find out that and more!!" All of course was to introduce a discussion on the book *The Foundation of Our Faith: Preparation of Membership in the Moravian Church* by the Rev. Kevin Frack.

## New Philadelphia Moravian Church makes a difference

Christianity is about showing the love of Jesus Christ and what better way to do it than reaching out in our own community. That is exactly what Sandra Gray is doing at New Philadelphia Moravian Church. An outreach ministry was started in 2007 with around 20 people. They met each Tuesday from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm.

Sandra Gray teaches a class of ESL (English as a second Language) during the school year. This program was started with the help of several members of the church. The first year it included nursery for small children with a paid worker. But given the economic circumstances, they could not afford to keep the worker. Sandra's granddaughter, Carrie, who is 16, now volunteers, taking care of 8 children ranging from 3 to 10 years of age. Currently, there is one ESL class that has continued these past three years with six persons: five from Mexico and one from Costa Rica. All have made tremendous improvement in their English. Announcements for these classes are made in the worship bulletin and newsletter, and also through the help of Mrs. Morris at South Fork Elementary School, which is next door to New Philadelphia.

We must reach out in our communities to show the love of Jesus Christ. Local churches have opportunities to become more involved as they support the initiatives made by their leaders and members. We invite your prayers for this small, yet significant ministry at New Philadelphia Church. Yet, we must not forget to pray for this ministry.
